OVERVIEW

This two-day symposium offers respiratory therapists and other health care providers the opportunity to participate in a state-of-the-art respiratory care seminar designed to update practitioners in their current and future practice. Subjects covered will enable practitioners to improve patient outcomes, as well as advance their knowledge and skills. The sessions will include discussions of the current advances in healthcare and skills needed for healthcare professionals to survive and thrive into the future. Day one of the symposium will focus on important diagnostic techniques and equipment currently available to clinicians and the atypical clinical presentation of disease in the geriatric population. Day two includes presentations on neonatal, pediatric, and adult populations. The participant may register to attend Day one (Thursday), Day two (Friday), or both days (Thursday and Friday).

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the symposium, participating health care practitioners will be able to:

- Interpret chest radiographs based on patient presentation, history, and chest film
- Identify key factors that could lead to improved diagnosis and management of COPD patients
- Describe age-associated changes in physiology which alter symptoms in the elderly.
- Describe how to identify sleep disorders based on poly somnography findings.
- Explain the clinical significance of volumetric capnography results.
- Describe the principle of volumetric capnography measurement.
- Describe techniques used in the NICU to decrease work of breathing.
- Differentiate between different disease processes based on pulmonary function results.
- Determine the best course of action in the management of patients in the emergency room.
- Differentiate between myth and fact based on a review of the literature.
- Describe current pharmacotherapy available to best manage the COPD patient.
- Identify key factors that determine the appropriateness of the use of ECMO in the pediatric population.

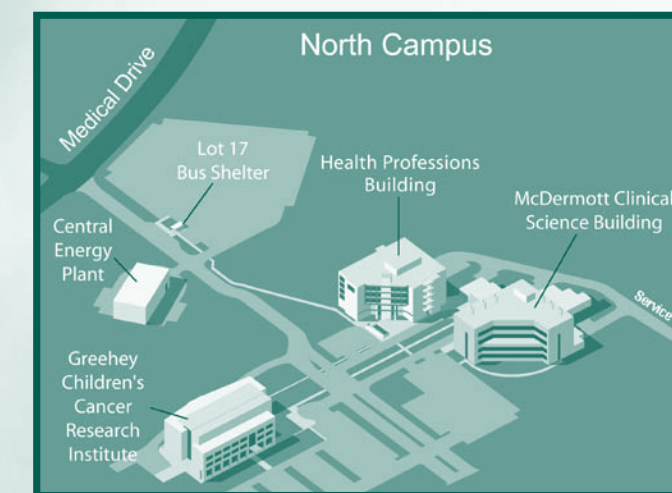
